



Rules of Life on Board - VOGUÉO

1. Welcome Aboard

We are delighted to welcome you for this cruise in Greece. To ensure your safety, comfort, and the preservation of the vessel, we kindly ask you to observe the following rules.

2. On Deck (Exterior)

- **Shoes:** The golden rule. Barefoot or clean, white-soled (non-marking) deck shoes exclusively. Street shoes must be removed before boarding and stored in the designated areas.
- **Sun Protection:** Please always use towels on the sunbeds and exterior cushions when applying sunscreen or oils to prevent permanent stains on the teak or upholstery.
- **Smoking:** For safety and odor reasons, smoking is strictly prohibited inside. Smoking is tolerated at the rear of the boat, downwind, in agreement with other passengers and using the provided ashtrays.

3. Cabins and Interior Usage

- **Marine Toilets (The Critical Point):** Do not throw anything into the toilets (no toilet paper, sanitary products, or wipes). Use only the bins provided for this purpose. Marine plumbing is very narrow; any blockage requiring technical intervention will be charged to the passengers.
- **Portholes:** Please never handle the portholes while sailing without the skipper's agreement to avoid any accidental water entry.
- **Fresh Water:** Although the Lagoon 52 is equipped with a watermaker, fresh water remains a precious resource at sea. Please use it sparingly during showers.

4. Energy, Air Conditioning, and Generator

- **Air Conditioning Management:** Out of respect for the environment and for silence at anchor, please turn off the air conditioning in your cabin or the saloon as soon as you leave the room.

- **Lighting:** Please get into the habit of turning off unused lights.
- **Generator:** Responsible energy management limits the generator's running time, offering you and your neighbors at anchor more peace and serenity.

5. Safety and Navigation (Skipper's Authority)

- **Skipper's Authority:** The skipper is the sole master on board regarding safety and navigation. Their decisions concerning itineraries, maneuvers, or moorings are final and binding, as they are dictated by the safety of the vessel and its passengers.
- **Safety at Sea:** Wearing a life jacket may be required at the skipper's simple request.
- **Dinghy:** The use of the dinghy is strictly reserved for the skipper or takes place under their direct supervision.

6. Respect for the Crew

- **Onboard Relations:** If you have chosen the option with a Skipper and/or Hostess, they are maritime professionals here to ensure your safety and comfort. They are your hosts, not servants. Basic courtesy and mutual respect are the foundation of a successful atmosphere.
- **Private Space:** Please respect their rest periods as well as access to their private quarters.

7. Children on Board

- **Supervision:** Children remain under the constant supervision and exclusive responsibility of their parents at all times.
- **Babysitting Option:** For your peace of mind, a "Babysitting" option can be added (upon prior request) to assist you in supervising the younger ones during the cruise.

8. Respect for the Environment and Others

- **Pollution:** Nothing should be thrown into the sea (plastics, cigarette butts, food).
- **Noise Disturbance:** Please respect the peace of other boats at anchor, especially after 10:00 PM.
